One of the biggest boosts for the future growth of the National Barrel Horse Association came when Mario lavarone took an interest in the NBHA.

The NBHA's brand of organized barrel racing has been a perfect match, like pizza and pepperoni.

That working relationship between the NBHA and lavarone took a giant step when the NBHA produced the barrel racing segment of the prestigious Fiera Cavalli equestrian fair in Verona, Italy.

"In 2006, we went to this fair for the first time with the USA team competing with two other countries, Italy and France," said Sherry Fulmer, executive director of the NBHA and the International Barrel Horse Federation.

"That led us later to being in charge of the show with nine countries participating," Fulmer added. "Our agreement was that everyone who competed had to be a member of the NBHA, so that established our NBHA brand deeper in Europe."

lavarone worked with the NBHA to create three exciting days of competition runs with each country fielding a team of two riders.

The USA Team of Chad Crider of Huntingdon, Tenn., and Scott Brown of Danielsville, Ga., now have become international champions three times.

This year it is expected for teams from 16 countries to be participating in the Fiera Cavallia fair with the NBHA again in charge of the show.

"We couldn't pull off such an amazing international event without the help and enthusiastic support of Mario lavarone," Fulmer said. "And that's why we want to salute him as our 2009 Unsung Hero."
